Letter from WM - 10 Jan 1976. Asking various questions, see reply below.

Important letter to WM dated Jan 19 1976 –

He has researched from Nova Scotia to Georgia.

He had recorded 317 tide mills in all.

Most in one state: was 95 in Maine.

US mills in operation from 1630's to about 1930.

One is operating now - a rebuilt mill operating for tourist in Long Island, NY.

Copy letter to PM – 20 April 1977. Thanking for the meeting together the previous week – etc.

Copy letter to PM – 4 August 1977. He enclosed copy of pamphlet on Windmills in Devon.

Letter to WM – Sept 22 1977. Feed-back on pamphlet – plus Slade Mill extract for WM.

Copy letter to PM - 27 Feb 1978. States his England and Wales listing is now 169. Queries whether a joint article for a publication was possible.

Letter, plus copy to WM – March 27 1978. Thanks for previous letter and contents of February above. Just been through the worst winter blizzard for 100 years. His article on Slade Mill not finished – more data to add. Joint article on American tide mills not considered as he has other third party considerations. PM in better health currently.- his chemotherapy seems to be working.

Letter to WM – March 20 1979. In reply to WM letter date of a month before. He has been working on his income tax and sorting out papers – but he states he is still well. Be patient – wait a while – still not made maps of tide mills in America – will develop them eventually.

Letter to WM – July 25 1979. Reply from PM to request to write on tidal power for 'History Today'. He accepts with suggestions and notes. Admits to other deadlines!?

Letter from PM's daughter (Nancy) to WM – September 21 1979. My father died suddenly last Sunday.

Copy letter to Mrs Meigs – 1 October 1979. Very sincere condolences. Walter states that MP hoped to leave all his papers on tidemills to him when he died. Could he come and see her when in America next April?

Letter to WM from Yvonne L. Meigs (Mrs Meigs) – March 16 1980. Thanking WM for copy of 'History Today'. PM died on Sunday 16th March. Needs time to settle husband's estate. Then decide on how best to use the tide mills collection but it goes to no-one at this time. Ends by stating, bad error by WM within article on Sea Power – relating to Meuse River in Belgium, having Rupelmonde tide mill? Wrong river – should be Schelde River.!!

Copy letter from YM to WM – March 24 1981. Begins by stating she will be at home on 21, 22 & 23 April. She has gone over PM's diaries from late 1976 – Nowhere did she find any mention of his wish to give WM papers on tide mills after he died. Ends by stating – coming here to talk, would be a waste of your's and my time.

Letter from YM to WM (at NW University, Evanston, Illinois – May 23 1982. In reply to WM letter of May 17th. A frosty reply to a request to meet her next June (11th) – Never free on Saturdays. She has two grandsons who are familiar with field research and will eventually tackle the Tide Mills.

Copy letter to YM - 26 May 1986. MW states he is still trying to write up his tidemill material and hopes to publish it in a volume to be issued by the University here this summer. Has gaps in his American information – can only get about 200 out of 350 sites information. No information about SC and Georgia and little for Virginia. Help? Lists four articles he has from PM in the past.

Letter from YM to WM in reply – June 18 1986. Sorry cannot help you at this time.

Last item – is a Brown University Memorandum - dated April 14 1993. Dinner and after reception in the History Department. If you are interested cost is \$6.00 ASAP.
